In North Carolina, victims of car accidents can choose to sue the negligent driver in small claims court. The jurisdiction of a small claims court regarding personal injury and property damage is limited to a maximum of \$10,000, exclusive of filing fees and court costs. ### North Carolina Car Accident and Personal Injury Laws

North Carolina is like most states in that the statute of limitations that applies to a car accident lawsuit will usually be the same as the one that applies to most personal injury cases. Specifically, North Carolina General Statutes section 1-52 says that a civil lawsuit for injury or damage to property must be filed within three years.

### Medical Liens in North Carolina - Everything You Need to Know

North Carolina's mandatory minimum insurance requirements include liability insurance of at least: \$25,000 for bodily injury to or death of one person, \$60,000 for bodily injury to or death of more than one persons. \$25,000 for property damage in any one accident. Supplemental uninsured motorist.

### North Carolina Car Accident Settlement Process and ...

North Carolina law (G.S. 20-279.21) also requires insurance coverage for uninsured/underinsured motorists, as well as minimum bodily injury and property damage limits. This is required for all policies, even if they exceed the minimum requirements.

### Official NCDMV: Vehicle Insurance Requirements

Under North Carolina's modified comparative negligence rule, your compensation will be reduced to \$8,000 (or the \$10,000 total minus the \$2,000 that represents your share of fault for the accident.) North Carolina courts are obligated to follow this rule in an injury lawsuit that makes it to trial, and don't be surprised if the adjuster raises the issue of North Carolina's comparative negligence rule during settlement talks.

### North Carolina Personal Injury Laws & Statutory Rules | AllLaw

North Carolina Motor Vehicle Law requires that Automobile Liability coverage be continuously maintained. The minimum coverage requirements are \$30,000 Bodily Injury for each person, \$60,000 total Bodily Injury for all persons in an accident and \$25,000 for Property Damage. Motor Vehicle Law also requires Uninsured/ Underinsured Motorists coverage.
